DeCamp makes more history with EPA-compliant D coaches



Robert DeCamp Jr. and his son Jonathan toured the MCI Winnipeg and Pembina plants.

In 1870, the DeCamp family got into the transportation business with a horse and wagon running between Roseland and Newark, New Jersey.

In May, president Robert DeCamp, the fifth generation of DeCamps to run the company,

visited MCI's Winnipeg and Pembina plants to personally take delivery of 13 new D4505 coaches equipped with 2007 clean-diesel Caterpillar engines.

"It gave me the opportunity to speak to Bryan Couch (MCI's vice president of product development).

Walking through the plant, I thought of things that I wanted to discuss," said DeCamp. "It was great to be right there and have Bryan listen to me."

About the new engines, DeCamp said, "Some in the industry are petrified of new improvements to models. I'm not worried. If there are problems, I know they'll get corrected." DeCamp runs 50 MCI coaches in its 76-coach fleet.

Each of the new D4505 coaches feature the new Caterpillar C-13 engines built to the new 2007 Environmental Protection Agency standards and teamed with an Allison B-500 transmission. The coaches also feature six LCD flat-screen video monitors with a DVD and CD player, and 55-passenger Amaya seating.
